1. Substance Misuse Trends

Update on current biggest challenges relating to substance misuse in the locality within the last 3 months

Update on any changes in substance misuse need in locality in last 3 months

Referrals to Turning Point initially reduced at the beginning of lockdown. However in the last month referral has been approximately back to pre-lockdown rates. Fewer service users are dropping out of treatment and fewer are being discharged as having successfully completed treatment – this may be because with the current measures in place people are less able to gain support from others and fill their lives with other ways to 'move on'. This means we have more service users in treatment.

The Loughborough office is still open Mon-Fri 9.30am-5pm for these appointments, plus needle exchange and drop-in for any emergencies.

Everyone entering the building is required to wear a face mask, and we are only able to have one person in the waiting room at any one time.
