SHISHA COMPLIANCE GUIDE

If you are the owner of a café, bar or restaurant which sells shisha, you need to make sure you are doing it legally. To do this you must ensure that your business fully complies with the following.

1: Planning Permission And Building Control	4Open. There is no charge and the registration cannot be refused. 5: Smoking Shelters - Health Act 2006 The Smokefree(Premises and Enforcement) Regulatios 2006	Size Signature of the state of	Smokefree, bans smoking in all enclosed public places and work places. Shisha Cafes have to comply with this requirement. Therefore shisha can only be smoked outside in the open air, or where a smoking shelter is 50% open and it must remain 50% open at all time. If you build a smoking shelter it must be at least 50% open - all of the time. Doors, windows and tent/marquee sidepanels will be classed as part of the wall if they can be shut or rolled up. Similarly if rugs, carpets, sheeting, furniture, plants are used to block the open spaces/on the perimeter so that the area is no longer at least 50% open, you will be breaking the Smokefree Law and could be fined. 7: Fire Safety The Regulatory Reform (Fire Safety) Order 2005		The owner of the business must make sure that a written Fire Risk Assessment is undertaken. There must be means of tackling a fire. For example, fire extinguishers and have persons that are trained to use them. There must be an adequate means of raising the alarm in the event of fire. It is illegal to sell shisha tobacco products | Leicestershire County Council which do not comply with the Trading Standards requirements of Regulations 7 to 10 of Business Line: 0116 305 8000 the Tobacco Products (Manufacture, Presentation, and Sale) Regulations 2002 and Amendments Regulations 2007.

Businesses are advised to contact their suppliers and request that Shisha tobacco products are brought into compliance as a matter of urgency.

As a temporary measure whilst the above is taking place, we request that you warn your customers about the dangers of smoking tobacco shisha by an appropriate display in a menu, label attached to shisha pipes or other prominent means.

9: Under-age Sales The Children and Young

Persons Act 1933 (as amended)

The Children and Young Persons (Protection from Tobacco) Act 1991 9As amended)

It is illegal to sell tobacco products to anyone under the age of 18

It is an offence to sell Shisha containing tobacco to anyone under the age of 18. Selling a Shisha product to an underage person carries a maximum penalty of £2,500.

If you are unsure as to a person's age vou should ask for identification. We recommend you adopt a Challenge '21' policy and keep a refusal log.

(Challenge 21 posters and a refusals log can be provided on request)

It is also a legal requirement to display a notice at the point of sale where tobacco products are sold. The notice must be no less than A3 size and the characters no less than 36mm in height.

10: Paying Tax on Tobacco

Shisha containing tobacco is liable for **HM Revenue and Customs Helpline**: excise duty. From 1 January 2014 herbal | Tel : 0845 010 9000 shisha containing no tobacco will also be Monday to Friday 8.00am to 8.00pm subject to excise duty.

As a guide – if you are currently Hotline 24/7 purchasing Shisha for less than £10 per 100 grams it is likely that this is an illicit product and the duty and VAT hasn't been paid.

> A criminal conviction for the evasion of duty and VAT could lead to a sentence of up to 7 years imprisonment

> Illicit products will be liable to seizure

> You can receive an assessment for the duty due and a penalty of up to 100% of the duty amount.

11. Health and Safety Health and Safety At Work etc. Act 1974 and associated legislation



All businesses need to comply with current health and safety law. This requires duty holders to ensure that the premises and any equipment or substance used is safe and without risks. Business must ensure that safe working practices are followed; identify any potential hazards; provide employees with suitable information, instruction, and training; and prevent or control exposure to substances that may damage health.
