Undertakes an evidenced based review of the effectiveness of the LCDG and the LEDG 2. Seeks a long-term solution to the management of the increasing volume of Community Triggers activated within Charnwood 3. Has due cognisance of the national CSP Review commissioned by the Government and the strategic objectives they have set as part of that review 4. To review and develop the Partnership Drug Action plan to ensure all relevant partners are involved and takes into account the new National Drugs Strategy: ‘From Harm to Hope: A 10 Year Drugs Plan to Cut Crime and Save Lives’ 5. <p>Update/s - including specific work, initiatives, projects etc. that contribute to Theme 1</p>	<p>Analysis of Quarter One and Quarter Two show that the CSP’s target of reducing ‘All Crime’ has not been met and there has been an increase of 351 extra crimes.</p> <p>The partnership has seen a reduction in</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Robbery - decrease of 5 crimes ● Cycle Theft – decrease of 46 crimes ● Shoplifting – decrease of 30 crimes ● Violence with Injury – decrease of 97 crimes <p>But the partnership has seen an increase in</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Burglary Residential – an increase of 31 crimes ● Burglary – Business – an increase of 78 crimes ● Theft of Vehicles – an increase of 80 crimes ● Theft from Vehicles – an increase of 155 crimes <p>The following beats have the highest ‘All Crime’</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Beat 62 at 1508 Crimes with an increase of 62 crimes ● Beat 65 at 1248 Crimes with a reduction of 16 crime ● Beat 61 at 1203 Crimes with an increase of 76 crimes <p>The partnership is aware of the identification of a second Urban Street Gang operating within Loughborough, which will have a significant demand upon partnership resources, with the increases in significant levels of youth disorder and increases in Crime</p>

<p>Update/s - including specific work, initiatives, projects etc. that contribute to Theme 2</p>	<p>In line with this Strategic Objective, the CSP has now received funding bid for round 4 of the Home Office’s ‘Safer Streets’ scheme. The Charnwood CSP project has the support of the Violence Reduction Network (VRN) and the OPCC, who has listed it as the LLR priority bid. The Funding was not received until Q2, which has delayed progress and implementation, but the plan is that the CSP will undertake the following workstreams:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Identify or recruit a Projector Co-ordinator – Initial meetings have been held with the Police to look at a funded Officer to assist and lead on some of the intervention work. ● Deliver enhanced diversionary activity to prevent and deter youth offenders engaging in ASB – GoGetta will be undertaking this in the main key locations in Charnwood.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Develop a marketing campaign aimed at behavioural change, with the aim of reducing youth related ASB – To be Developed. • Develop and implement enhanced training for staff engaged with youth ASB, Community Leaders and Businesses affected by anti-social behaviour – To be developed. <p>The CSP has seen a reduction in Violence with Injury of 10.6% with a reduction of 97 crimes with Beat 62, Beat 61 and Beat 65 having the highest Violence with Injury crime.</p>

Update/s - including specific work, initiatives, projects etc. that contribute to Theme 3	<p>In keeping with the CSP’s directive, a commitment has been made to invest in practitioners engaged in ASB case management, which has included Risk Management, 6th July and tackling Student ASB, 23rd September 2023, both of these training events included partners from other agencies. There is further training around Community Triggers is being planned</p>



Here are the proposed steps for the 2023/24</p> <p>Step 1: Instead of giving funding up front, each CSP is given an allocation for them to request funds against.</p> <p>Step 2: CSPs can make proposals on projects/expenditure against this allocation for OPCC to review</p> <p>Step 3: Performance & Assurance / OPCC reviews and scrutinises requests from CSP areas to ensure they are in line with the Police and Crime Plan, local need and represent good value.</p> <p>Step 4: Proposal granted or declined.</p> <p>Step 5: Funding released against their proposed projects/funding request.</p> <p>Step 6: Projects undertaken – as we know what the projects are, we link this in with Comms/Events/Digital to promote PCC</p> <p>Step 7: Quarterly monitoring forms are returned to track delivery of projects.</p> <p>Step 8: End of year review with all CSP leads to discuss what has worked well/lessons learnt. Any remaining funds not used from allocations can either be made into a separate grant or added into the following years allocation</p>
