Charnwood Borough Council recognises the value and contribution of voluntary sector organisations and the benefits they provide to the residents of Charnwood. The establishment of a local lottery is seen as an additional tool and way of providing support to bring in additional funding to the voluntary sector.

Through the Council's Voluntary Sector Development Officer we provide a range of support to help these organisations and groups access the funding support they need.

It is the Councils aim to ensure that the Charnwood Lottery is inclusive of all voluntary sector organisations and supports organisations across a range of protected characteristics, as outlined in the Equality Act 2010.

What specific group/s is the policy designed to affect/impact and what is the intended change or outcome for them?

It is the Councils aim to ensure that the Charnwood Lottery is inclusive of all community groups and funding supports projects targeting individuals/ residents across a range of protected characteristics, as outlined in the Equality Act 2010.

Analysis will therefore be undertaken to ensure that the organisations signed up and supported are distributed in a reasonable and proportionate manner.

Which groups have been consulted as part of the creation or review of the policy?

The need for additional funding to support and retain the capacity within Charnwood's VCS is an ongoing discussion across the whole sector.

The proposal has been discussed with a number of voluntary sector organisations and further consultation will be undertaken during the development phase of the project.

Evaluation takes place on successful to analyse whether there any gaps with regards to the protected characteristics in order to ensure the grants process is fair and equal to all.

In particular analysis is undertaken to determine any barriers which may prevent specific community groups/ communities of interest from successfully applying or even applying at all to Charnwood Grants.

Many of the voluntary sector organisations currently supported impact upon a diverse customer base because of the universal acess to the services they provide, although a number of them are more specifically targeted towards individuals / groups that are covered by the protected characteristics e.g. age, disability.

The information tells us that the voluntary sector organisations supported provide a range of services that acknowledge individuals from protected characteristics.

It is acknowledged that some of the voluntary sector organisations support individuals with multiple characteristics and those projects supporting the wider community have a wide range of beneficiaries.

Where possible equalities information is provided as part of the monitoring data from voluntary sector organisations that are awarded a grant by the Council. There are a number of organisations that specifically cover age, disability, race, religion, sex.

	The scheme will therefore create a positive impact in relation to the protected characteristic of Age.			
Disability (Physical, visual, hearing, learning disabilities, mental health)	As the scheme is web enabled it is not anticipated that there will be any detrimental impact.			
	It is anticipated that there will be a number of VCS organisations that sign up that provide services relating to disability.			
	In addition it is acknowledged that some of the organisations that will benefit are cross- cutting and support individuals with multiple characteristics. Therefore, creating further positive impacts for people with disabilities.			
	The scheme will therefore create a positive impact overall in relation to the protected characteristic of Disability.			
Gender Reassignment (Transgender)	Neutral Impact - specific marketing / promotion of Charnwood Lottery could take place where specific support groups etc. meet for further awareness raising.			
Race	It is anticipated that a number of VCS organisations will sign up that support services relating to Race. In additional it is acknowledged that some of the projects funded are crosscutting and support individuals with multiple characteristics. The scheme will therefore create a positive impact overall in			
Religion or Belief (Includes no belief)	relation to the protected characteristic of Race. The Charnwood Lottery will not specifically support religious groups/ activities, but will support to faith groups who are delivering activities for the wider community.			
Sex	The impact is therefore neutral with regards to the protected characteristic of religion or belief with the acknowledged that wider benefits are created for the wider community. It is anticipated that a number of VCS organisations will sign			
(Gender)	up that support services relating to specific genders.			
	In addition it is acknowledged that some of the projects funded are cross- cutting and support individuals with multiple characteristics.			

Sexual Orientation	The process has therefore created a positive impact in relation to the protected characteristic of Gender. Neutral Impact - specific marketing / promotion of Charnwood Lottery could take place where specific support groups etc. meet for further awareness raising.
