Background

The diversion of Footpath i56 (part) running from across land on Chestnut Farm Cossington, from Humble Lane Cossington to bridleway i102 near syston mills Cossington as part of the planning application submitted by the Barber Farm Pernnership for the of Change of use of land from general industrial land (Use Class B2) for the erection of a solar farm (26MW) with associated works, equipment and infrastructure.
